

#### The Parable of Two Sons:

God calls us to follow him and help him in the work of his Kindgom but sometimes we do not say "Yes" to him right away. However, God forgives us when we admit our wrongs and his love helps change our minds about what we ought to do. ### 3. Some things to think about before we read the Gospel.

Hi friends! Today, we're going to read the parable of the two sons who were workers in the vineyard and talk about our answer to God's call.

Yes, older or younger whether we know it or not we all are called by God to live our lives with love, charity and mercy.

Now, we have to understand what was happening to Jesus when he told this story or parable of the two sons working in the vineyard to the high priests in the Temple.

Jesus was frustrated with the high priests in the Temple who were doubting Jesus' words and actions. Can you imagine the scene? It sounds strange to think about Jesus doing such a thing and getting so angry.

But friends, what He saw happening was so wrong. Jesus wanted the high priests to change their mind and to listen truly to Him with an open heart. So he told them a parable. In thd parable, Jesus talks about two sons and how they react to the father's request to work in his vineyard. He told this story to show that people answer differently to God's request to follow his teaching in life or "working in His vineyard."

We all have a call from God to answer in our life. Do you have any ideas what your call may be today? It doesn't need to be super hard or super complicated. God loves simple things done with love.

Helping others and being nice with them means answering quickly God's call in our life. So, as you can see, it is important being nice with family and friends and helping them. It is very pleasing to Jesus because we are following his instructions and teachings on how we should live and work for Him when we do our jobs well and that's what our Gospel reading for today (Matthew 21:28-32) will explain to us.

Okay everyone, let's get ready to listen and learn with our eyes, ears, and hearts wide open!

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### Gospel Reflection & Activity:

Hi again friends, good job on being attentive to today's readings! Now let's see what we learned with a few questions.

Who refused to work in the vineyard right away when their father asked?

- A. The older son
- B. The second son

What did the older son do after refusing?

- A. He changed his mind.
- B. He went for a nap.

What did the second son do when his father asked him to work in the vineyard?

- A. He said yes, and went to work right away.
- B. He said yes, but then did not go into the vineyard to work.

The older son did what his father wanted and he was honest when asked to do a task. Jesus is teaching us that when we listen to what is preached, it should create a change in our hearts and actions. Even if we didn't say yes right away to God, He is a forgiving God and he will be right there for us when we change our minds. So it is important to show the love, charity and mercy that Jesus teaches us in our actions. Now friends what's one way you can show love, charity (giving), or mercy (forgiving) this week?

Hey Friends, can you find God's Kingdom?

Start at the beginning and make your way through the maze. And don't get discouraged if you have to backtrack or start again. Remember that Jesus is always ready to give us another chance to get things right!
